



GUIDE TO BUYING

Auctions

Auctions are held at Auction Your Car on Saturdays from 11am.

The Vehicles

Details of the vehicles to be auctioned can be viewed at www.auctionyourcar.com.au the day before the auction, or catalogues are available on site on the day of auction at the registration desk. Vehicles are offered for auction in the order that they appear in the catalogue. Auction Your Car does not own any of the vehicles being offered for sale. Vehicles are sold on a consignment basis only.

Vehicle Viewing

Auction Your Car is open for vehicle viewing on Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday from 10am to 4pm and from 9am Saturday.

Roadworthy Certificates

All vehicles offered for sale are offered on an as is basis unless otherwise expressed by the Auctioneer. It is the purchaser's responsibility to obtain a Roadworthy Certificate.

Vehicle Condition

Each vehicle is road tested to a speed of 60km/h and rated on Engine, Transmission, Differential, Clutch and Air-conditioning / Heater performance. Ratings are as follows:

- Serviceable for Age - functioning correctly given vehicle age and distance travelled.
- Requires Attention – Not functioning as designed, rectification required.

Independent mechanical reports covering the above mentioned plus interior and exterior conditions are available on some vehicles, these reports are more in depth and have been requested and paid for by the owner of that vehicle. Vehicle reports are affixed to the passenger side or front windscreen of the vehicle.

Before Bidding

In order to make a bid during an auction, you must first register to bid. This can be done at the registration desk and is completely free. It is important to read the terms and conditions on the bidders agreement before signing.

Buyers Premiums

Buyer's premiums are applicable on all vehicles sold at Auction Your Car. Buyer's premium rates are expressed at the front of the auction catalogue and are not included in a bid on a vehicle.

About Bidding

To make a bid during the auction, raise your hand to get the Auctioneer's attention. The Auctioneer will ask for bids of a certain amount or at a certain increment to the previous bid. By raising your hand, you are placing a bid at that price. Once you have bid, the bid cannot be retracted. Once bidding has concluded on a vehicle, the vehicle will be declared as *Sold*, *Referred* or *Passed In*.

Sold

If a vehicle is declared by the Auctioneer as sold, the highest Bidder has won the vehicle. The purchaser is then required to make a deposit on the vehicle before leaving the premises. Please see Deposits for more information.

Referred

If a vehicle is declared by the Auctioneer as Referred, the highest bidder has not won the vehicle but is entitled to first negotiating rights with the vendor. This is done through our Auction representatives either during or after the auction.

Passed In

If a vehicle is declared by the Auctioneer as Passed In, the vehicle did not receive a bid or bids made were not close enough to the reserve to be considered by the vendor. If you are interested in a vehicle that was passed in, please see an Auction representative after the auction.

Deposits

If you won a vehicle at auction you are required to make a deposit of \$500 or 10%, whichever is the greater. The balance is due within 3 business days of the purchase. This can be done by cash, EFTPOS or business cheque. Auction your car does not accept AMEX, Diners Club cards or personal cheques. Please note a 1.5% surcharge applies to EFTPOS payments exceeding \$3000.

Paying the Balance

The balance can be paid using cash, EFTPOS, cheque or through a bank transfer. Vehicles cannot be released until funds have cleared into our account.

Vehicle Release

Auction Your Car is unable to release any vehicle until it has been paid for in full. We also do not release any vehicle while an auction is running.

Registration Transfers

It is solely the responsibility of the purchaser to transfer the registration of a vehicle into their name within 14 days of purchase, for more information contact Vic Roads on 13 11 71. Unregistered vehicle permits are available through Auction Your Car by request, charges apply. Please be aware it is illegal to drive an unregistered vehicle without a permit
